<b>Fact 4</b>	There are more than 80,000 species of me growing worldwide, and I come in all shapes and sizes.	I am usually less than 5 metres in height and my stems are no more than 8cm thick.	I am home to 80% of the UKs woodland birds.	I have less trees than a woodland.
<b>Fact 5</b>	I can sit out in winter, waiting for the warm weather to return.	I grow in the wild and I am not pruned regularly.	I support over 2000 species including the hedgehog, dormouse, and most species of bat.	I am home to ground-nesting birds.
<b>Fact 6</b>	My branches grow from a crown.	I have thick foliage that caterpillar moths like to munch on.	I am a useful corridor allowing wildlife to move safely.	I am characterised by my low nutrients.
<b>Fact 7</b>	I have a single woody stem (unless I have been cut or regrown).	My branches grow from ground level, forming a crown without a stem.	I am a line of two or more trees or shrubs creating a boundary feature.	I am a rare and threatened habitat.
